The beautiful wildflowers that grace our mountain meadows, trails and roadsides are one of the many reasons to enjoy living in Summit County. Unfortunately, there are a number of these beauties that are considered invasive and noxious weeds by state and county authorities and we have some of them right here in Silver Shekel. Our residents have done a good job removing these plants in the past, but there are a few properties where they are blooming nicely right now.

While there may be a few other species of invasive plants here, the white daisies are the most common. These are likely False Chamomile or Oxeye Daisies, depicted below, and they are best removed by pulling, bagging and putting in the trash.

The Silver Shekel Owners Association urges all owners and residents to take the time to get rid of these plants that are on your properties.
