Tiger Run Resort issued a warning to their residents about mountain lions. One was seen in their community a few days ago. The information has not been corroborated with the authorities, however, we wanted our residents to be aware of the situation described at Tiger Run.

Hello Tiger Run Guest and Owners,

We have had another mountain lion (cougar) sighting at the resort. Our staff has reached out to the officials at Colorado Parks and Wildlife so they are aware of these sightings. At this time they are not moved to take any actions but will continue to monitor the area and take corrective actions if needed to protect our guests/owners and to protect the animal.

This can be an alarming experience but we want you all to know that there are things you can do to help protect your families while discouraging the wildlife from remaining in the area. If they are looking for food and are unable to obtain it, they will move on to another area.

Day to day precautions:

- Be aware of the risks and the animal's nature. Cougars are most active at dawn and dusk. They will stalk their prey, so stay alert but not anxious.
- Travel in groups. Never allow children to play alone or walk alone. Try to keep them within arms reach when walking through the resort.
- Stick to well lit areas when walking or playing during the mornings and evenings.
- Educate your group on what to do if a cougar is seen. Make noise, back away toward more people or a structure, make yourself seem larger, never turn away from the animal, throw rocks and sticks to deter the animal, and fight back aggressively if attacked.
- Keep your pets on a leash at all times.
- Do not leave trash or food out.

If you see a cougar, follow the guidelines in the attachment (below) to get your group to a safe place. If you are unable to get back to your cabin or RV please call our office at 970-453-9690 or after hours at 970-406-8522 and we will escort you back to your site. Once you have safely returned to your site please call and report the incident directly to the CPW at 970-725-6200 or CSP at 970-824-6501 if it is after hours or on a weekend.

Please use the attached document along with the information listed at <https://cpw.state.co.us/lions> to help educate your group. Keeping our guests and owners safe is our top priority but we would like to do everything possible to avoid conflict and protect the local wildlife. Interactions with humans often leads to the animal being displaced or euthanized which should be avoided when possible.

WARNING! **COUGAR IN AREA**

There have been several cougar sightings in the area. It is advised that you all encounter a cougar but please to remain calm and do not panic. If you see a cougar, please follow the guidelines below.

Please take precautions when walking through the resort:

- Do not allow young children to wander unattended
- Travel in groups when possible
- Treat your group to be aware of their surroundings

If you encounter a cougar:

- DO NOT APPROACH
- Remain calm, do not panic
- Make as much noise as you can
- Make yourself look big
- Remain calm and do not run away from it
- Retreat to home to as soon as possible south on the trail
- If apprehended, calm down, show your arms, show things
- If attacked, fight back aggressively
