Noxious Weeds in Silver Shekel

Dear Silver Shekel Property Owners,

Once again, we are asking our residents to help by removing the noxious weed on their properties and in the right-of-way along the streets.

The recent wet weather makes pulling these weeds much easier, so this is a good time to do it!

The beautiful mountain wildflowers that grace our mountain meadows, trails and roadsides are one of the many reasons we enjoy living in Summit County. Unfortunately, there are a number of these that are considered invasive and noxious weeds by the State and Summit County authorities, and we have a number of them right here in Silver Shekel.

The large expanses of white daisies we see around are likely invasive False Chamomile or Oxeye Daisies. Common Tansy and Buttercups are also found here as well as Musk Thistle. See the photos below. [Click here](#) for a complete list and descriptions.

The Silver Shekel Owners Association urges all owners and residents to take the time to get rid of these plants that are on your properties, soon before they go to seed. The best way is by pulling, bagging and disposing of them in the trash.

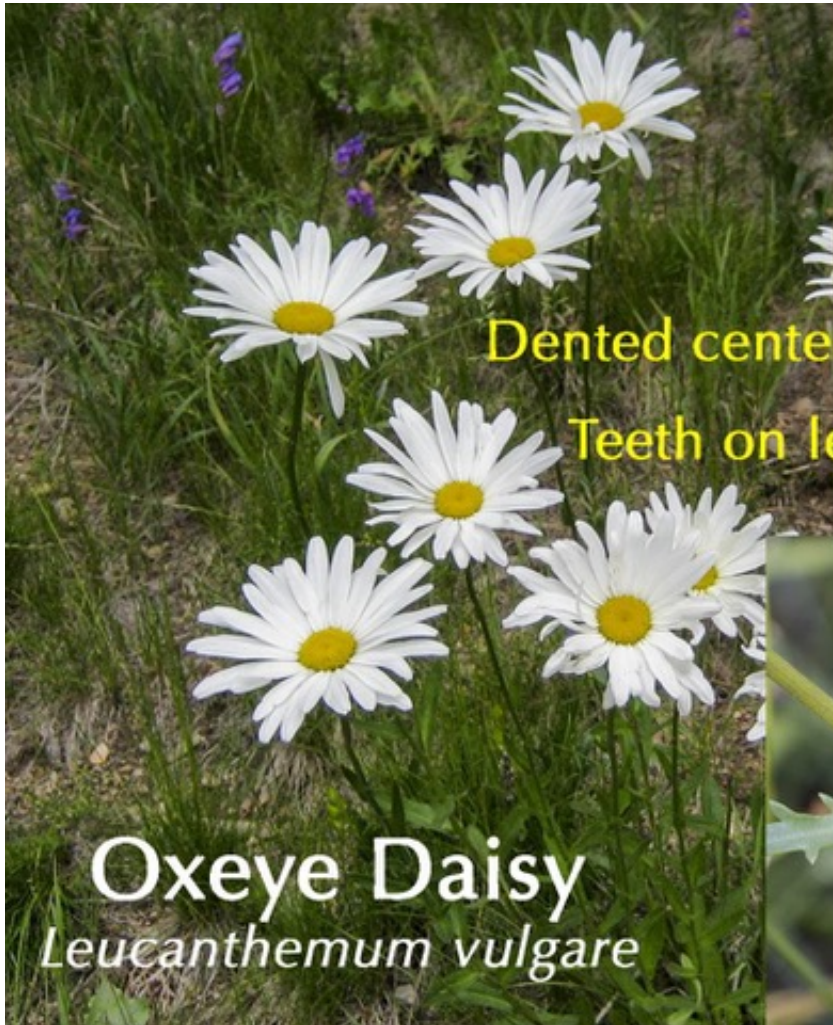

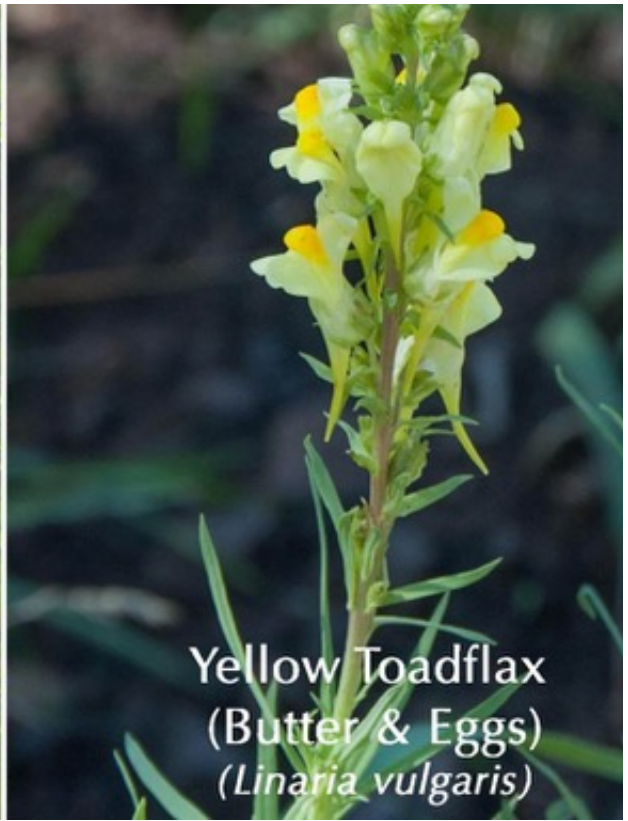
